Our Park—Some Facts

- The 78-acre park was dedicated as Eugene’s first city park in 1906.
- The Park contains a 58-acre forest with numerous hiking and walking trails.
- The forest contains one of the valley’s remaining oak woodlands, the Oak Knoll.
- Nationally recognized Rhododendron Garden contains 15 acres.
- The F.W. Wilkins Shelter was constructed by the WPA in 1938 (rebuilt in 1999 - only the original chimney remains).
